Loyola University Medical Center (LUMC)

- More than 570-bed teaching, quaternary referral hospital known for excellence in clinical care. A few examples:
- Top burn center in the region

Edward Hines Jr. Veterans Administration Hospital (Hines)

- Located on a 147-acre campus adjoining LUMC. Hines is the “flagship” of the Chicago VA system and the second largest VA in the nation
- Hines has specialized programs in Tele-mental Health, Outpatient Mental Health, Intensive Case Management, Consultation-Liaison and Suicide Prevention. It also has specialized treatment for returning veterans, for substance abuse (including opioid maintenance program and ambulatory detoxification), geriatric psychiatry (including an on-site extended care center), clozapine pharmacotherapy, homeless and chronic mentally ill populations, home-based care, vocational rehabilitation and PTSD treatment

- Among large VA hospitals, Hines ranks second nationally in quality indicators (2008)
