Before you start:

Students should be familiar with the basic anatomy of the liver, kidney, and pancreas prior to starting their rotation.

Students should also have a general understanding of the indications for liver and kidney transplant.

Students need to contact the APNs via email (please include both APNs listed on the email) a few days prior to starting the rotation to clarify the details of when and where to show up on the first day of their rotation.

Expectations:

Students are expected to participate in daily rounds with the surgical team. The students will touch base with the APNs each morning to pre-round on their assigned patients and will be responsible for presenting those patients during daily rounds with the surgical attending. It is expected that these presentations will include a brief history of the patient's course in hospital as well as overnight events, pertinent lab imaging, and physical exam findings, and a plan for the day. The student will then be responsible for following up on any tests conducted throughout the day and review these findings with the APNs, surgical resident, fellow, or attending as needed.

Students are expected to attend clinic when daily rounds are complete if/when there are no cases in the operating room. While in clinic the students will work with all members of the multi-disciplinary team, including the nephrologist/hepatologist, the surgeon, the dietician, social worker, pharmacist, and transplant coordinator. The students will be expected to see new and return patients, conduct a history and physical as relative to transplant evaluation or post-transplant status of the patient. **Students should dress professionally for clinic.**

Students are expected to participate in the operating room for all elective cases and all after-hours cases as duty hours allow. If students are in the operating room overnight, they will be excused from regular duties the following day as necessary. Students are expected to have a basic level of knowledge about the patient, the pertinent anatomy, the operative steps, and the reasons for proceeding with the operation prior to arriving in the operating room.

Students are expected to inform the team if they have a scheduled leave of absence or need an urgent or emergent leave of absence.

The general expectations of the surgery clerkship also apply to this rotation as well and are outlined on the home page in LUMEN for review.

ALL students will comply with the 80 workweek requirements.
