

Use these guidelines from the Teaching Academy for your teaching sessions.

For All Teaching Sessions:

Review pages 1-4 as needed to deliberately focus on your teaching skills before the session. These pages are meant to be tips for you, not a detailed assignment. Select the one or two things that you think will best help you to bring out your best teaching style and work on those.

For Small Group:

Write brief, but THOUGHTFUL, REFLECTIVE answers to the questions on the page titled **“Post-Observation Meeting”**

We will not use the “Observer’s final comments and suggestions” as set up in this format. Rather we will use this for self-reflection and improvement.

You may wish to get feedback from the facilitators if there is time. We will be asking M4s in small group to give you feedback also.

Submit this page immediately after small group to Maureen Locklund, room 310.

For Teaching at the Bedside or On Rounds:

Ask a faculty member to observe and comment on your teaching. Give them the guidelines ahead of time, (print out a copy of pages 2-4). Have them comment on page 2: **“Peer Observation—Clinical /Small Group Teaching”** and be sure to tell them these are guides, they do not need to comment on each item. **Have them print and sign their name.**
