




Labor and Delivery "L&D"

Logistics

- 2nd floor main hospital
- Wear scrubs during your shift, LONG white coats when you leave unit
- Girls: Women's Locker room available
- Guys: Russo OR locker room
- Bring laptops as computers are limited
- Attendings = "LUFOG" group

Expectations

- Evaluate and present all triage patients
- Ultrasound!
- Follow all laboring patients
- Participate in deliveries
 - Pushing!
 - Placental delivery
 - Scrub in to cesarean deliveries

Extra ways to be helpful

- Take ownership of your patients
- Anticipate what will be needed for work-up of your patients (i.e. speculum, slides, ultrasound with towel, etc...)

Bonus

- Suturing and knot tying skills
- Work on developing your differential diagnosis (at least 3 diagnoses)
- Present a clear and easy to follow HPI
 - Keep oral presentations <u>concise</u>
 <u>and formal</u>
- Present a 5-minute presentation on an obstetric topic
- Make friends with the nurses!
- Observe circumcisions!

Maternal Fetal Medicine "MFM"

Logistics:

- MFM = High risk OB
- Inpatient care (2nd floor hospital, L&D)
- Clinic (LOC 2nd floor, Women's health)
- Dress clothes everyday
- Attendings:
 - o Sprawka, Lal, Alrahmani, Perdigao
- Fellows:
 - Nuong Troung, Stephanie Rodriguez, Katherine Patton

Expectations

- Round on antepartum patients each morning & write progress note
- In clinic, measure fundal height, heart tones, help with documentation
- Present short topic of interest
- Participate in US and genetic counseling

Extra ways to be helpful

- Help obtain records on transport patients
- Annotate glucose logs for diabetic patients
- Help transport patients from clinic/ultrasound to L&D for safety if needed

Logistics

- Inpatient care (Cancer floor = 6SW)
- Surgery (Russo + ASC)
- Clinic (Cancer Center, Clinic A)
- Attendings: Drs. Potkul, Liotta, Winder
- Scrubs + Dress clothes everyday
- Focus: Cancer of the Vulva, Vagina,
 Cervix, Uterus, Fallopian Tubes, Ovaries

Expectations

- Clinic: Return patients only! Move fast.
- Inpatient: Pre-round on patients
 - o 24hr events-SOAP format
- Surgery:
 - Know anatomy!
 - Know your patients!!

Extra ways to be Helpful

- Always have 10cc syringe in pocket
- Page/text resident when patient rolling back
- Write patient info on dry erase board
- Be helpful in OR (bed, belt, SCDs, stirrups)
- Walk with your patients in AM, practice incentive spirometer, SCDs in place
- Manipulate uterus

Bonus

- Robotic surgery!
- Big open surgery!
- You get out what you put in!
- Suturing laparoscopic ports

- Rounds in the AM
- Surgery (ASC + Russo)
- Gyn Procedure Clinic Wednesday Afternoon
- VA OR on Tuesdays
- See all consults in ED or inpatients
- Attendings: LUFOG group

Expectations

- Scrub into hysterectomy, adnexal surgery and hysteroscopy
- Clinic: Observe colposcopies, biopsies, and IUD placements
- Work-up of abnormal uterine bleeding
- Practice Bulletin presentations weekly
- COME PREPARED TO CASES AND CLINIC

Extra Ways to be Helpful

- Walk with patients
- Text you resident when the case is going to the OR
- Help with patient positioning
- Grab your gloves before scrubbing in
- Practice incentive spirometer with post op patients
- See consults when we get them
- Practice suturing at home

Expectations

- Dr. Cox-Pedota will let you know about student presentations, weekly readings, and education simulations
- Be willing and able to help see triages, consults, and assist with deliveries or surgeries
- Be prepared before going to the OR

Ambulatory

Logistics

- Various Loyola clinics Resident + Attendings
- VA clinic with Dr. Williams (12th floor)
 - o Email, Page, or Text Benign Gyn intern (Danielle Graves)
 - O DO NOT PAGE OR EMAIL DR. WILLIAMS

Expectations

- Arrive early
- Look up your patients prior to arriving to clinic
- Ask attending/resident prior to clinic how you can be helpful
- See patient first, then present to attending and resident
- Fetal heart tones by doppler and fundal heights for OB patients

Bonus!

- Speculum exams, pap smears, collecting GBS swabs
- Ultrasound with OB return patients

Professionalism and Communication

Texting:

- <u>Ask permission</u>: some people prefer not to share their phone numbers. *(most now probably prefer AMS Connect)*
- <u>Timing</u>: try to anticipate ahead of time, we are often busy with patient care and may not be able to respond.
- <u>Content</u>: try to find the answer via other sources first? (<u>A friend</u>? Google?
 Your clerkship materials?)
- Method: Would an email be more appropriate? (less urgent, a lot of logistical info...)

Last minute advice...



- Keep an open mind!
- Be a team player
- Make your EPIC surgery and clinic schedules <u>now</u>, so you know what is coming for the week
- Make sure you have scrub access today!
- This may be the last exposure to this specialty for the rest of your career; if you are the <u>only</u> medical professional on an airplane and someone is delivering, you should be able to assist!
- Find ways to incorporate your interests into the rotation
- If you haven't heard/ don't know where to go for your first day- REACH OUT
 TO US!!:)

SCHEDULE HELP

TLDR: For any surgical case you need to know what the case we are doing is, why we are doing it, general medical/surgical history, and basics of the case and general anatomy!

The way to learn this is by reviewing the night before, so you must have schedules ready in epic. Showing up the day of a surgery without knowing who we are operating on or what we are doing is UNACCEPTABLE...



Signout Times

- -Loyola L&D: 7 AM in mornings, 8 AM on Saturday and Sunday
- -Benign gyn/Onc/Urogyn: whenever your team specifies for rounding
- -For urogyn clinic, show up ~15 minutes before first scheduled patient
- -MFM: preround on assigned patients by 7 AM L&D signout
- -Macneal L&D/gyn: signout at 7 AM on L&D every day
